



1969 Diary, 20 year old woman, Dayton Ohio




This is the diary of a 20-year old young lady from 1969. When the diary starts out, the diarist and her friend Ginny are in New York on vacation, staying at the Taft Hotel. On their flight home they meet a young man on the plane, and drink some Southern Comfort (Sweet Tennessee Sippin' Whiskey), and have a nice relaxing trip.

Back in Ohio, the diarist returns to her office job, secretarial and payroll duties. She practices yoga regularly, and parties with her friends. She is very involved with a man called Galen, and she discusses him a great deal in the diary – their drinking, driving, partying and parking.



The diarist appears to be head-over-heels in love with Galen, but he does not seem to return her feelings. Galen is a heavy drinker and is usually fairly well-oiled when he sees her.



This diary is a continuing story rather than a series of regular entries. There are only 105 pages of writing, but most of the pages are very full. It is written in ink and very legible.

This diary is in

good condition, except for a torn spine and a tear on the first page. It measures about 5 1/2" X 4".

There is a great deal to be researched and studied about the author of this diary. What happened to her? What became of her affair with Galen? This is a fascinating look back into the life of a young woman coming of age in the late 1960s.
