Fitzroy Street, Soho, W1:

1949: Rent: £1/5 s. 6d. (one pound 5 shillings and sixpence) a week, privately rented top floor flat. In June 2016 a flat in Fitzroy Street would cost around £755,000 (¥119,694,684). Updates at Zoopla and other property websites.



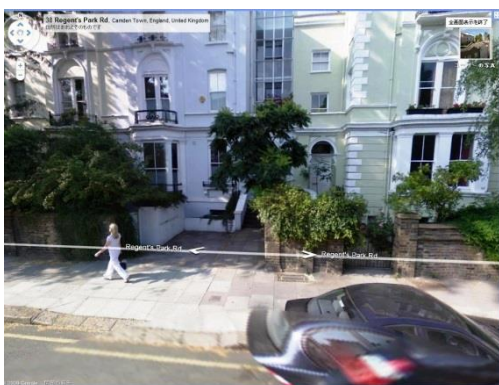

Unable to raise the £2,000 asking price, the family moved up the road to a smaller flat in Regent's Park Road, Camden Town, NW1: 1960

Rent £15:00 week from Camden Council. Today, the same flat would cost millions in sterling and many more millions in Yen.



Barrowgate Road, Chiswick, W4: sold for £12,000 (¥1,902,946.81) in 1964

In June 2016 a nearby flat at no.54c in Barrowgate Road sold for £1,760,000 (¥279,059,083.53)



Park Avenue South, Hornsey, N8. Bought for £1,850 (¥293,328.45) in 1964. Sold for £1,050,000 (¥166,506,887.88) in 2012. Price 4 years later £1,800,000
